
#### Who are New Americans?

New Americans are people who were born outside the U.S. who moved to the U.S. to live here.

- New Americans = immigrants and all newcomers.
- New Americans can be people who have recently moved to the U.S. or people who have lived here for decades.
- Some new Americans are people with disabilities and developmental disabilities.

#### Why is Understanding Immigration Status Important?

- Immigration status refers to the type of presence a person has in the U.S.
- You cannot determine someone's immigration status based on how they look, their culture, or the language they speak.

#### **Immigration status affects:**

- Eligibility for public benefits like **Medicaid** and Supplemental Security Income (SSI).
- Authorization to work in the U.S.
- Whether someone is lawfully present in the U.S. at the time.



#### Pathways to an Immigration Status

- One's immigration status can change over time.
- Immigration laws and policies often change.
- An immigration attorney can consult with someone who is undocumented, or any new American in need, to determine if they have a pathway to obtain an immigration status.
- NYS Office for New Americans (ONA) offers free immigration legal support & screenings.

#### **Work Authorization for New Americans**



- Non citizens can be work authorized in the U.S.
  - Many new Americans are authorized to work in the U.S!
- There are different forms of documentation that demonstrate authorization to work in the U.S.
- Understanding work authorization can help new Americans with disabilities to access disability employment services.

#### **Work Authorization**

- The green card is evidence that someone is legally authorized to work in the U.S.
- New Americans with certain immigration statuses are eligible for an Employment Authorization **Document (EAD)** which enables them to work lawfully in the U.S.
- Refugees and asylees are granted work authorization through their status which is documented by their I-94 form. They can also get an EAD as additional proof of employment authorization.
- Connect new Americans who are work authorized employment services.

## Refugees, Asylees, & Asylum Applicants



**Refugee status** is applied for and granted before entering the U.S.

**Asylum status** is applied for inside the U.S., either at U.S. border, a port of entry, or after an individual has entered the country with a different immigration status or without a status. After an individual has been granted asylum, they are officially recognized as an asylee and have the legal right to stay in the U.S. and receive protections.

Asylum applicants have applied for asylum but have not yet been granted asylum status. Asylum applicants have not had their right to remain in the U.S. determined.

## Refugees, Asylees, & Asylum Applicants

Nsayi was granted refugee status before entering the U.S.

Carlos came to the U.S. without a status. Within the U.S., he applied for asylum and after 8 years he was granted asylum status.

Chen is an asylum applicant. He applied for asylum in the U.S. but has not yet been granted asylum status.

## Refugees and Asylees

#### **Benefit Access:**

- Refugees and asylees have a 7-year limit to accessing Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits.
- Refugees and asylees must become U.S. citizens to keep or reinstate SSI benefits after the 7-year limit ends.



Support & Connect with an immigration attorney to naturalize to keep SSI benefits before the 7-year limit expires.

#### Take Aways


- Immigration status affects access to work authorization and public benefits.
- ➤ One's immigration status can change overtime.
- Immigration law and policies often change.
- >Assist new Americans with disability employment services and work opportunities as well as benefits they are eligible for, as needed.

American with disabilities.



#### ONA Bilingual Coordinator Program - Case Management for Disability Services




- Launched in February 2023.

- Connects clients with disability and mental health services with a focus on connecting with OPWDD services.








#### What's in Voyage?



- Multilingual information on child development (2 months – 5 years) and the early identification of disabilities.
- Each copy is bilingual with all content in English and a second language.
- Provides ages for developmental screenings (starting at 9 months), autism screenings (starting at 18 months), Well-Child Visits, developmental milestones, activities to promote child development, and disability resources in NYS.
